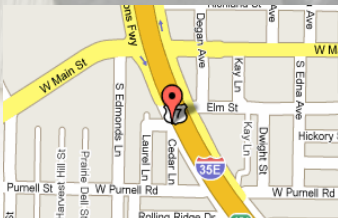

**Shelley E. Potter '78** of Dallas, TX serves as The Association of Former Students' Immediate Past Chair. She is a landscape architect and President of POTTER Architecture in Longview and Dallas.

Shelley graduated summa cum laude with a bachelor's degree in Landscape Architecture from Texas A&M University in 1978. As a student, she was Chair of MSC OPAS, member of Who's Who, and a founding member of the Chi Omega Fraternity chapter. She currently serves as the fraternity's National Vice President and was a delegate to the National Panhellenic Conference from 2000 to 2004. Exemplifying community service, Shelley's resume includes numerous civic boards such as the Longview Planning & Zoning Commission and Smart Growth Task Force. A member of the American Society of Landscape Architects and former park planner for the City of Longview, she served as President of the Junior League of Longview and

President of Longview 2020 Forum. Shelley was elected President of the Deep East Texas A&M Club in 1995, a position preceded by her service as Vice President for Fundraising.

From 1997 to 2004, Shelley acted as the Area 30 Representative for The Association of Former Students before being elected to The Association's Board. While on the Board, she chaired the Constituent Network Task Committee and the Building Enhancement Task Committee. . She's the Past Chair the Board of Directors for the Texas A&M Association of Former Students, the second woman and first graduate from the College of Architecture to hold the position; prior to her appointment, as a member of the board, she chaired the association's Building Enhancement Task Committee for the \$17 million renovation to the Clayton W. Williams Jr. Alumni Center. Shelley has also served on Texas A&M University's Presidential Search Committee.

She and her husband, Jeff '78, were recently recognized as two of the 2009 Outstanding Alumni for the College of Architecture for their many contributions to Texas A&M, their community and profession.

## Page 1 Background Photos

Each month, the DCAM Newsletter hosts a photo taken on campus. In Sept., the Corps Arches were featured.

### **Corps Arches**

Symbolizing the spirit of the 12th Man, the Corps Arches serve as the entry point to the Corps of Cadets Quadrangle or "quad." The quad is the home of the Corps with residence halls housing every cadet and Duncan Dining Hall feeding the Corps.

Part of Texas A&M since 1876, with the mission of "training leaders of character and competence for service to nation and state," Texas A&M's Corps of Cadets is the largest uniformed student body apart from the national service academies. Although membership carries no military obligation, the Corps is also responsible for commissioning more officers into the U.S. military than any school other than the academies. The Corps includes the largest military marching band in the United States with approximately 375 members.

In Oct., we featured a shot of the beautiful verdigris dome atop the Academic Services building.

### **Academic Services Building**

The Academic Building stands at the crossroads of the campus. Completed in 1914, it stands on the site of Old Main, the first campus building, which burned to the ground in 1912. Its most prominent feature is its copper dome, which is green with oxidation, much like the Statue of Liberty. The practice of polishing the dome was stopped due to the danger the glare posed for pilots landing at nearby Easterwood Airport. When the building was constructed, it was one of the first on campus to use rebar. Its architect, A&M Professor F. E. Giesecke knew little about reinforced concrete, "so [he] just figured out the amount of steel...necessary and doubled it". The result was an extremely durable building so filled with steel that blowtorches had to be used when piping for water fountains was added. In front of the Academic Building is the Academic Plaza, which is the site of a wide range of campus events, most notably Silver Taps.

This month, we feature the full-sized replica of the Liberty Bell, awarded the State of Texas that hangs from the ceiling of the Academic Services Building.

### **Liberty Bell**

In 1950, the United States Department of the Treasury assisted by several private companies selected Paccard Foundry in Annecy-le-Vieux, France, to cast 55 full-sized replicas of the Liberty Bell. The bells were shipped as gifts to states and territories of the United States and the District of Columbia to be displayed and rung on patriotic occasions. This was part of a savings bond drive held from May 15 to July 4, 1950 with the slogan "Save for Your Independence." What is one thing you would tell us that no one would guess about you? I once filmed a commercial for Tom Thumb

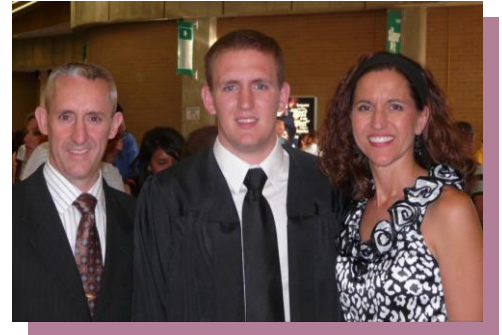


## *Introducing Christina Pope!*

## Unbelievable Sweet Potato Casserole

Preheat oven 350 degrees

2 large cans Sweet Potatoes (drain or bake 5 large fresh)

1 C sugar

6 large eggs

1 C milk

1 t vanilla

2/3 C butter, melted

Beat eggs well, add sugar, vanilla and incorporate. Add milk then potatoes. Pour into well-greased casserole. Pour melted butter on top.

1 C shredded coconut

1 C pecan pieces

1 C brown sugar

1/3 C flour

1/3 C butter melted

In new bowl, mix: coconut, pecans, brown sugar, and flour. Pour on top of potato mixture. Pour melted butter on top.

Bake uncovered for 25 to 30 minutes. Should be bubbly and the topping crispy and browned at the edges! Enjoy!
